Review:

- 1. CogAT Scores
- 2. If student is identified as LEP, review LEP documents.
- 3. Review student's education record to ensure student had adequate academic exposure (ex: consistent enrollment and good attendance).

Recommendation:

- If there are several items answered as 'no' and review has been conducted, send RFA to assessment staff to obtain parent consent for Developmental Screening.
- If there are language/communication concerns, the SST and SLP can determine if a speech screening is needed.
